The Smithsburg EMS (SEMS) is in dire need of upgrading its ambulance fleet. Fortunately, there is a cost-effective solution to this problem that does not require purchasing a new ambulance. By replacing the old ambulance cab with a brand-new chassis, SEMS unit can keep its fleet in top shape. This is especially important since no ambulance is available with the local fire departments. The Smithsburg EMS covers more than 5,700 residences in its primary response area. SEMS primary response area covers approximately 70 square miles. It includes the communities of Smithsburg, Leitersburg, Mt. Aetna, Cascade, Pen Mar, Fort Ritchie, Ringgold, Cavetown, Wolfsville, and a portion of the Appalachian Trail. Keeping the fleet running smoothly is critical to provide timely medical assistance. The Smithsburg EMS is grateful for its numerous supporters who have contributed to fundraising. Maintenance costs associated with this project will be covered through these annual funds.
