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1 (a) An individual who has the human immunodeficiency virus may not knowingly 2 transfer or attempt to transfer the human immunodeficiency virus to another individual.

3 (b) A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor 4 and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or imprisonment not exceeding 5 3 years or both.]
