1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Government – Grants and Contracts – Reimbursement of Indirect Costs

3 FOR the purpose of altering the rate at which certain nonprofit organizations receiving 4 State-funded grants or contracts may be reimbursed for indirect costs; <u>requiring the</u>

- 5 Department of Budget and Management to study and report on certain grant or
- 6 <u>contract recipients;</u> and generally relating to State–funded grants and contracts.

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

5 6 7 8	(4) "OMB Uniform Guidance" means the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards adopted by the Office of Management and Budget in 2 C.F.R. 200 and any related guidance published by the Office of Management and Budget.

10	(i) a grant or contract awarded on or after October 1, 2018;

$22 \\ 23 \\ 24$	(3) This section does not require the reimbursement of indirect costs incurred under a multi-year grant or contract described under paragraph (1)(ii) of this subsection during any fiscal year that begins before July 1, 2019.
25 26 27 28	(c) If a nonprofit organization is a direct recipient or subrecipient of a grant or contract for the provision of services that is funded wholly with State funds or with a combination of State and other nonfederal funds, the terms of the grant or contract shall allow for reimbursement of indirect costs:
29 30	(1) at the same rate the nonprofit organization has negotiated and received:
31	(i) for indirect costs under a direct federal award; or

6	<u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:</u>
7	(a) (1) This subsection applies only to a nonprofit organization that:
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8	(i) is the recipient or subrecipient of a grant or contract described
9	under § 2-208(c) of the State Finance and Procurement Article, as enacted by Section 1 of
10	<u>this Act, that exceeds \$1,000,000; and</u>

11	(ii) receives an indirect cost rate set in accordance with $\S 2-208(c)(2)$
12	of the State Finance and Procurement Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, between
13	<u>October 1, 2025, and October 1, 2028.</u>
14	(2) For each nonprofit organization described under paragraph (1) of this
15	subsection, the Department of Budget and Management shall examine:
16	(i) the salaries of senior staff;

17	(ii) the organization's administrative expenses; and
18	(iii) if the organization was the recipient or subrecipient of a grant or
19	contract and received an indirect cost rate set in accordance with § 2-208(c)(2) of the State
20	Finance and Procurement Article before October 1, 2025, a comparison of the indirect cost
21	rate received before October 1, 2025, and the rate received during the study period.
22	(b) On or before December 1, 2028, the Department of Budget and Management
23	shall report its findings under subsection (a) of this section to the Governor and, in
24	accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation
25	<u>Committee and the House Health and Government Operations Committee.</u>
26	SECTION 2. <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
27	October 1, 2025 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of
28	the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths
29	of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall
30	take effect from the date it is enacted.
