G1 5lr1806 HB 40/24 - W&MCF SB 313 By: Delegates Kaiser and Wilkins Introduced and read first time: January 16, 2025 Assigned to: Ways and Means Committee Report: Favorable House action: Adopted Read second time: February 27, 2025 CHAPTER AN ACT concerning Election Law - Postelection Tabulation Audits - Risk-Limiting Audits FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections, in collaboration with the local boards of elections, to conduct a risk-limiting audit after each statewide election; authorizing the State Board, in collaboration with the local boards, to conduct a risk-limiting audit after a special general election; authorizing, rather than requiring, the State Board, in collaboration with the local boards, to conduct an automated software audit after a statewide election; repealing a requirement to conduct a manual audit after each statewide general election; and generally relating to postelection tabulation audits. BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Election Law Section 11–309 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Election Law 11 - 309.(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
