SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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
- 23 (a) In this section, "unused sick leave" means sick leave credit that:
- 24 (1) has not been used before retirement; and

That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



- 1 (2) was available to the member to be used as sick leave during 2 employment.
- 3 (g) (1) This subsection applies to a member of the Correctional Officers' 4 Retirement System who:
- (i) was a member of the Employees' Pension System or Employees' Retirement System and was transferred from the Employees' Pension System or Employees' Retirement System to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System as a result of a change in membership within the several systems that rendered the individual ineligible for membership in the Employees' Pension System or the Employees' Retirement

- 11 (ii) did not transfer service credit from the Employees' Pension

- 28 (ii) The creditable service for unused sick leave shall be calculated
- 29 for each of the two State systems by multiplying the total amount of unused sick leave,
- 30 calculated in accordance with subsection (e) of this section, by a fraction:

- 32 the State system, not including the creditable service for unused sick leave; and
- 33 the denominator of which is the total creditable service

- 1 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, on retirement 2 under this section, a member is entitled to receive a normal service retirement allowance 3 that equals one fifty–fifth of the member's average final compensation multiplied by the 4 number of years of creditable service.
 - (2) On retirement under this section, if a member's annuity is greater than the member's normal service retirement allowance calculated under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the member's normal service retirement allowance shall equal the member's annuity.
- 9 (c) (1) This subsection applies only to:

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- 10 (i) a correctional case management specialist, supervisor, or 11 manager who has a combined total of 20 years of eligibility service as provided in subsection 12 (a)(1)(ii) of this section; or
- (ii) a member serving in a position specified in § 25–201(a)(8), (9), (10), (11), (12), [or] (13), OR (14) of this title who has a combined total of 20 years of eligibility service as provided in subsection (a)(1)(iii) of this section.
- 16 (2) A member is entitled to receive a normal service retirement allowance 17 that equals an allowance based on the creditable service the member has in the 18 Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 20 (a) This section applies to an individual who:
 - (1) is employed in a position affected by this Act on July 1, 2025; and
- 22 (2) has creditable service in the Employees' Pension System before July 1, 23 2008.
- 24 (b) Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d) of this section, on June 30, 2026, 25 the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall transfer the 26 service of an individual described in subsection (a) of this section from the Employees' 27 Retirement System or the Employees' Pension System to the Correctional Officers' 28 Retirement System.
- 29 (c) On or before June 1, 2026, an individual described in subsection (a) of this section who was transferred into the Correctional Officers' Retirement System under this Act may elect not to transfer the individual's Employees' Retirement System or Employees' Pension System service to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System by submitting to the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System a form provided by the State Retirement Agency for the purpose of electing not to transfer service under this Act.

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(d) If an individual described in subsection (a) of this section who was transferred into the Correctional Officers' Retirement System under this Act submits an application for retirement to retire before June 30, 2026, the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall transfer the individual's service from the Employees' Retirement System or the Employees' Pension System to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System prior to the effective date of retirement, unless the individual elects not to transfer the individual's service in accordance with subsection (c) of this section.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 9 (a) This section applies to an individual who:
- 10 (1) is employed in a position affected by this Act on July 1, 2025; and
- 11 (2) has no creditable service in the Employees' Pension System before July 12 1, 2008.
- 13 (b) An individual described in subsection (a) of this section shall have the 14 individual's service credit from the Employees' Pension System transferred and combined 15 with the individual's service in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 17 (a) This section applies to an individual who has service from the Employees' 18 Retirement System or the Employees' Pension System transferred into the Correctional 19 Officers' Retirement System under this Act.
- (b) If an individual described under subsection (a) of this section is granted an ordinary disability benefit under Title 29, Subtitle 1 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall calculate the ordinary disability benefit under §§ 29–106 and 29–108 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article and grant the greater benefit to the individual.
- SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2026, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
