2 Department of Aging – Aging Services – Program Repeal and Consolidation

3 FOR the purpose of repealing provisions of law requiring the Secretary of Aging to develop 4 certain congregate housing and assisted living programs for seniors; repealing the $\mathbf{5}$ Interagency Committee on Aging Services and transferring certain responsibilities 6 of the Committee to the Department of Aging; authorizing the Department to 7 perform certain duties to implement and coordinate services to older adults and to 8 collaborate with certain entities that establish local interagency committees; 9 requiring the Department to establish, coordinate, and supervise a program to 10 provide single points of entry within each planning and service area; authorizing 11 area agencies on aging to make agreements with certain entities and provide staff at 12the single points of entry for certain purposes; requiring the Department to develop, 13 coordinate, and administer with area agencies on aging or other persons a certain 14 system to provide certain services to certain older adults; requiring the Department 15to engage with key stakeholders to conduct certain transition planning and to provide certain services to certain older adults; and generally relating to the 16 17Department of Aging and aging services.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed 24to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or 25application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of this Act. 26SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 3 of this Act shall take 27effect June 1, 2025. 28SECTION 4. 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in 29Section 5 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
