#### **SENATE BILL 271**

1 (b) State personnel, as defined in § 12–101 of the State Government Article, are 2 immune from suit in courts of the State and from liability in tort for a tortious act or 3 omission that is within the scope of the public duties of the State personnel and is made 4 without malice or gross negligence, and for which the State or its units have waived 5 immunity under Title 12, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article, even if the damages 6 exceed the limits of that waiver.

11 (6) **(I)** a sheriff or deputy sheriff of a county or Baltimore City; **OR**

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 2025.
