BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 3-902.(a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (1)

20 21	(d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on convictio is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or both.
22 23 24	(e) (1) An individual who was under visual surveillance in violation of this section has a civil cause of action against any person who conducted or procured another to conduct the visual surveillance.
25 26	(2) In an action under this subsection, the court may award actual damage and reasonable attorney's fees.
27 28	(f) This section does not affect any legal or equitable right or remedy otherwis provided by law.
29	(g) This section does not affect the application of § 3–901 of this subtitle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

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October 1, 2025.
