1 AN ACT concerning

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Mold – Landlord Requirements and Regulations (Maryland Tenant Mold Protection Act)

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment, the Maryland $\mathbf{5}$ Department of Health, the Department of Housing and Community Development, 6 the Maryland Department of Labor, and the Department of General Services to 7 develop a certain pamphlet and website; requiring a landlord to provide a tenant 8 with certain information at certain times and in a certain manner; requiring a 9 landlord to perform certain tasks within a certain time upon receiving a certain notice; requiring the Department of the Environment, in consultation with the 10 11 Maryland Department of Health, the Department of Housing and Community 12Development, and the Department of General Services, to adopt certain regulations 13 on or before a certain date establishing uniform standards for mold assessment and remediation and reinforcing building codes; and generally relating to mold 14 15prevention, assessment, and remediation.
