House Bill 646 Judiciary (Delegate Taylor, et al.)

Task Force on the Creation of a Division of Returning Citizens and Expanded Reentry Services - Extension of Report Deadline and Task Force

This bill extends the termination date for the Task Force on the Creation of a Division of Returning Citizens and Expanded Reentry Services from June 30, 2026, to June 30, 2027. In addition, the bill extends the deadline for the submission of the required report of the task force from December 31, 2025, to October 31, 2026.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Extending the task force by one year – and extending the deadline for the required report – does not materially affect State operations or finances. Any additional expense reimbursements for task force members and staffing costs for the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS) are assumed to be minimal and absorbable within existing budgeted resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: Local government finances are not anticipated to be materially affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Chapters 936 and 937 of 2024 established the Task Force on the Creation of a Division of Returning Citizens and Expanded Reentry Services, staffed by DPSCS. The task force must (1) identify and assess the reentry services that exist in the State; (2) identify gaps in reentry services currently provided in the State; (3) assess the markers of successful reentry; (4) ensure that the recommendations of the task force equally consider returning citizens regardless of gender; (5) develop a plan to establish a Division

of Returning Citizens within DPSCS for specified purposes; and (6) develop a plan to expand specified services for individuals in the State after release from incarceration. Task force members may not receive compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for expenses, as specified. By December 31, 2025, the task force must submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly. The Acts terminate June 30, 2026.
