8 ~~Fifteen Thousand, Three Hundred Seventy Seven Dollars (\$1,179,615,377), One~~  
9 ~~Billion, One Hundred Eighty Million, Five Hundred Fifteen Thousand, Three~~

11 certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation,  
12 conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State, for

4 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
5 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014 in the total principal amount of  
6 ~~\$1,166,065,000~~ ~~\$1,170,615,377~~ \$1,180,515,377. This loan shall be evidenced by the  
7 issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a  
8 resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance  
9 with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and 8-131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement  
10 Article.
