SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED February 13, 2019

SB 884 Senator Jennings, et al

PUBLIC SCHOOLS – SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS – FIREARMS REQUIRED

Requiring a Baltimore City school police officer and a school resource officer to carry a firearm while present on the premises of the school to which the officer is assigned. EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019 ED, §§ 4-318(d)(3)(i) and 7-1508 - amended

INCOME TAX CREDIT – EMPLOYERS – ELIGIBLE INTERNSHIPS

Allowing certain employers employing certain interns a credit against the State income tax that may not exceed \$1,000 for each eligible intern or 10% of the wages paid to each eligible intern, subject to certain limitations; requiring a certain employer to enter into a certain agreement with a certain higher education institution; providing that not more than \$300,000 in tax credit certificates may be issued in any taxable year; requiring a report by the Comptroller on utilization of the tax credit by July 1, 2022; etc. EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019

PUBLIC UTILITIES – SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEMS

Altering the application of a provision requiring the payment of a certain deposit with the Public Service Commission in connection with an application to construct a solar photovoltaic system; requiring the Commission to refund the deposit within 1 year, rather than 18 months, after a person has obtained approval if the person has demonstrated that construction has commenced; altering the period of time from 18 months to 1 year within which a person may request a certain extension for a project that has not commenced construction; etc.

MOTOR VEHICLES – DUPLICATE DRIVER'S LICENSES – VICTIMS OF ROBBERY OR THEFT

Requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration, when processing an application for a duplicate license of a victim of a robbery or theft whose license is taken during the robbery or theft, to issue the duplicate license free of charge if the victim of the robbery or theft whose license is taken presents a police report of the incident when applying for a duplicate license.
