SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED March 4, 2019

SB 1041 Senator Nathan–Pulliam

PUBLIC HEALTH – CARE OF MEDICALLY FRAGILE INDIVIDUALS (CHANNING'S LAW)

Requiring the Office of Health Care Quality to establish, by December 31, 2020, a training program and a skills review and check for nurses who care for medically fragile individuals in the homes of the medically fragile individuals; authorizing the Office to contract or coordinate with a third party to meet certain requirements; requiring, beginning January 1, 2021, a nurse who provides care to a medically fragile individual to complete a certain training program before beginning to provide care except under certain circumstances; etc.

FAMILY LAW – REMOVAL OF CHILD FROM UNITED STATES – INJUNCTION

Authorizing a parent to bring an action for an injunction against the other parent to prevent the other parent from taking a child under the age of 16 years to a place that is outside the United States under certain circumstances; requiring a court to notify certain federal agencies if a certain injunction is granted to prevent the international travel of the child; requiring a court to hold a custody or visitation hearing as soon as practicable if a certain injunction is granted; etc. EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2019

CHILDREN IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE – QUALIFIED RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAMS (FAMILY FIRST PREVENTION SERVICES ACT)

Requiring the juvenile court to conduct a hearing to review the status of a child placed in a qualified residential treatment program and make a certain determination within a certain period of time after the child enters the placement; requiring the juvenile court to review a certain assessment and consider certain factors at a certain hearing; requiring the juvenile court to state, in writing, the reasons for its decision to approve or disapprove the continued placement of a child in a qualified residential program; etc.

SB 1044 Senators Carter and Hayes

LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT – MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIR AND CAREER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR EX–OFFENDERS

Establishing the Motor Vehicle Repair and Career Certification Program for Ex–Offenders in the Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning to provide apprenticeships to ex–offenders in motor vehicle repair and service; requiring the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to administer the Program and provide grants on a competitive basis to employers who are located in Baltimore City or Baltimore County, donate motor vehicles serviced under the Program to low–income families, and employ certain ex–offenders; etc.

This bill requires a mandated appropriation in the annual budget bill. EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2019 LE, § 11-603 - added Assigned to: Senate Rules
