SENATE BILLS INTRODUCED February 14, 2020

SB 1027 Senator Lam

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION – HEADS OF BUSINESS UNITS
– APPOINTMENT AND SENATE CONFIRMATION

Requiring that the Executive Directors of the Maryland Transportation Authority, Aviation Administration, and Port Administration, the Maryland Transit Administrator, the State Highway Administrator, and the Motor Vehicle Administrator be appointed with the advice and consent of the Senate; and requiring that the Executive Directors of the Maryland Transportation Authority, Aviation Administration, and Port Administration be appointed by the Secretary of Transportation with the approval of the Governor.

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SB 1028 Senator Rosapepe, et al**BALANCING THE STATE BUDGET**

Proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution authorizing the General Assembly to increase or add Executive Department items in the budget bill, provided that the total of the appropriation for the Executive Department approved by the General Assembly does not exceed the total proposed appropriation for the Executive Department submitted by the Governor; submitting the amendment to the qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2020 for adoption or rejection; etc.

SB 1029 Senators Carter and Smith**PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT – PERSONNEL AND INVESTIGATORY RECORDS – COMPLAINTS AGAINST LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS**

Establishing that a record relating to a formal complaint of job-related misconduct made against a law enforcement officer is not a personnel record under certain provisions of the Public Information Act under certain circumstances; authorizing a custodian to deny inspection of certain records involving a complaint of job-related misconduct made against a law enforcement officer; authorizing a custodian to deny inspection of certain records by a complainant only under certain circumstances; etc.

SB 1030 Senator Ready**INCOME TAX – SUBTRACTION MODIFICATION – RETIREMENT INCOME**

Authorizing a subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for certain retirement income attributable to certain out-of-state employment as a correctional officer, law enforcement officer, or fire, rescue, or emergency services personnel; and applying the Act to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2019.
