However, we know that continuing education beyond high school results in more positive economic outcomes for students, especially our students that come from low-income households. Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. is firmly committed to supporting efforts that facilitate low income students' matriculation through high school and to and through post-secondary education. As a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority's Prince George's County, I am in full support of HB1011 Maryland Higher Education Outreach and College Access Pilot.
