House Bill 839 Labor and Employment - Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program Establishment

Support

NCADD-Maryland supports House Bill 839 – Labor and Employment – Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program – Establishment. The creation of a Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) program in Maryland would allow families to take up to 12 weeks of paid leave to care for the birth or adoption of a child, family members with serious health conditions or disabilities, family members who are leaving for military deployment, or for their own health conditions.

For families dealing with substance use disorders, this bill would allow people who are in treatment or supporting a family member in treatment to take time off from work and focus on beginning the recovery process. People may need time off of work in order to take part in a residential program, or even an intensive outpatient program. People may need time off to support a family member in intensive treatment. The family member may need assistance with transportation and keeping track of appointments with counselors, case managers, and other health care providers.

With only one in ten people with a substance use disorder accessing treatment, policies like FAMLI will help people keep their jobs, keep their incomes, and find recovery. We urge a favorable report on House Bill 839.
