Subject: Senate Bill 341 - SUPPORT

Dear Chairman Pinsky and Members of the Committee:

The United States Public Health Service (USPHS) is one of the eight uniformed services (including the new Space Command) and is composed of over 6,500 officers with Public Health and Clinical Expertise. There are approximately 2,200 USPHS officers that reside in Maryland of which 1,500 are currently on Active Duty and the remaining 700 are retired.

The Commissioned Officers Association (COA) represents and advocates for the interests of USPHS officers. A major priority of the COA is to ensure that the Commissioned Corps officers maintain parity with our sister uniformed services.

SB341 updates existing law to ensure that a member of any of the <u>eight</u> uniformed services is eligible for a Home for Veterans supervised by the Department of Veteran Affairs. This technical revision basically changes "armed forces" to "uniformed services" and follows the.

The Commissioned Officers Association and the Maryland-based officers that I represent *STRONGLY* **SUPPORT passage of Senate Bill 341**. We ask the Committee to report a **Favorable** recommendation as the bill progresses through the legislative process.
