My name is Katherine Dangel, and I am 9 years old. I live on a farm in Mt. Airy, Maryland, in District 9. I am here today to urge you to vote yes on HB 229.

Chlorpyrifos is a toxin that can get into fruits and vegetables. I like eating fruits and vegetables and I don't want to worry about chlorpyrifos poisons. I want to eat healthy and not worry about getting my nerve system damaged. I don't want to not eat healthy because of toxins.

I want to eat healthy and the main way to do that is with my own fruits and vegetables. I want a garden. But if my neighbors use chlorpyrifos, that could pollute my garden.
