## Testimony of Senator Jill P. Carter In <u>Favor</u> of SB0705 - Maryland Transit Administration – Disabled Reduced Fare Program – Opioid Treatment Program Patients Before the Finance Committee on March 11, 2020

Mr. Chairman, Vice chair, and Members of the Committee:

This bill authorizes opioid treatment centers to issue reduced fare bus passes to its patients in good standing.

Addictions treatment and recovery is a frail process and even something that seems small can be catastrophic. Not having transportation to and from treatment is exactly one of those barriers. Allowing patients to purchase reduced-fare bus passes at their treatment program, rather than requiring them to make the trip to the <u>only</u> place in Maryland - 6 Saint Paul Street in Baltimore - where such a pass can be obtained, is just one way we can ease the burden on those struggling to maintain their recovery.

As the fiscal note points out, since 2017, this body has enacted no fewer than nine laws to address the opioid crisis in Maryland. The fiscal 2020 budget includes nearly \$710 million in funding aimed at the scourge of opioid addiction. This bill is revenue neutral. It provides a much-needed benefit to those fighting their addiction.

No-one is opposed to this bill. I urge a favorable report from this committee on SB 705.
