RE: HB 1485 – Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Emergency Services Transporters – Reimbursement – Letter of Information

Dear Chair Pendergrass and Committee Members:

The Department of Health (Department) respectfully submits this letter of information on House Bill 1485 (HB 1485) titled Maryland Medical Assistance Program - Emergency Service Transporters - Reimbursement.

The Department recognizes the importance of the issues raised by this bill and the similar bills on this subject, as well as the challenges faced by Emergency Medical Services (EMS) providers as they face high volumes of 9-1-1 calls and emergency department wait times that exceed the national average. The Department remains committed to addressing this subject and is currently working in conjunction with the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMMS) and the Maryland Health Care Commission (MHCC) to develop innovative models of care aimed at improving quality and lowering costs for the entire health system.

Should the Committee decide to move forward with this bill, the Department respectfully suggests that the Committee confer with the Appropriations Committee and limit any changes this year to a simple rate adjustment, in lieu of reimbursement for all service calls regardless of transport. A mandate to reimburse for all calls to service will result in a fiscal note in excess of the amount believed to be within the Chair's discretion. Currently, EMS providers are reimbursed a flat fee of \$100¹ per transport to specified health facilities. If that amount were extrapolated to all calls, the estimated additional funds required for the bill would be \$1,725,500 (50% GF/50% FF).
