The bill establishes that an "employer" may not be held liable for negligent hiring or failing to adequately supervise an "employee" based on evidence that the employee has been convicted of an offense under certain circumstances. The construction industry and ABC members in particular, have taken the lead over the past several years in hiring returning citizens. This provides one more incentive to expand this hiring process.
