Re: Support Senate Bill 157 – Employers of Ex-Offenders – Liability - Immunity

IEC Chesapeake supports Senate Bill 157 and requests a favorable report from the Judicial Proceedings Committee. Senate Bill 157 would provide immunity to certain industries, including the construction industry, when hiring an employee who has completed a term of imprisonment or probation. The employer cannot be held liable for the actions of an employee who meets the above conditions. Maryland employers who seek to hire exoffenders would be protected from unfair lawsuits for the actions of these hires. Senate Bill 157 is needed to further encourage employers to hire ex-offenders who often face significant barriers to employment when attempting to re-enter the workforce.
