House Bill 0234 - Child Support - Suspension of Payments and Arrears for Incarcerated Obligors - Modifications

Testimony of Delegate Shaneka Henson – Favorable with Amendments

JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

DISTINGUISHED MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE,
Chairman Clippinger, and Vice-Chairwoman Atterbeary, thank you for hearing
House Bill 234, a bill sponsored to provide common sense debt relief for
incarcerated child support payers by shortening the jail sentence eligibility
requirement – from 18 months, to 6 months – before a support payer is allowed to
access suspended payments and arrears adjustment.

Along with my testimony, I have submitted for the committee's review and consideration, two (2) amendments. Amendment No. 1 makes it clear that periods of incarceration resulting from failure to pay child support are not excluded from Family Law 12-104.1.

Amendment No. 2 requires the Child Support Administration to adopt regulations to implement the policy changes enacted by HB 234.
