**POSITION:** Oppose

The Maryland Judiciary opposes House Bill 458. This bill would establish a process for a petition for the emancipation of a minor.

The bill provides that a court shall appoint a lawyer to serve as a best interest attorney for the petitioner but does not identify any funding source for the representation.

In addition, the bill requires the court to hold a hearing within 60 days after the petition is filed, which interferes with the court's docket management. The 60-day time period is also unrealistic, given service and response timelines, and the requirement to appoint a best interest attorney to investigate the petition.
