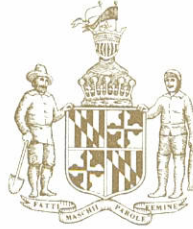

**RE: HB 1116– Criminal Procedure - Sexual Offenders - Lifetime Supervision.  
SUPPORT**

Good afternoon, Chairman Clippinger, and members of the Committee.

Thank you for the opportunity to present HB 1116 – Criminal Procedure - Sexual Offenders - Lifetime Supervision.

HB 116 would require more convicted sexual offenders to be placed under lifetime supervision. The bill adds all circumstances of second-degree sexual offense as that crime existed before October 1, 2017, an attempt to commit a second-degree sexual offense, and sexual abuse of a minor, regardless of the minor's age, as crimes that require lifetime supervision.

**WHY IT'S NEEDED**

Under current Maryland law, only some offenders who sexually abuse minors are placed under lifetime supervision. This is a loophole in the law.

This requirement should extend to all who commit this heinous crime on a minor, regardless of that minor's age. Currently, lifetime supervision is required for offenders whose victims are aged 12 and under, yet 2 out of 3 of crimes are committed on children aged 12-17, and they are not protected by their abuser. The max these offenders can receive under current law is 5 year probations.

By requiring lifetime supervision for these offenders, HB 1116 protects Maryland's children from offenders who have already been convicted of these crimes and reduce the number of repeat offenses. This bill is prospective and does not apply to any conviction before the bill's effective date. I respectfully request a favorable report on HB1116. Thank you for your consideration.
