Chairwoman Kaiser and members of the Committee,

Greetings, My name is Kuijuan Jackson. I am a youth organizer with the Communities United. I am 21 years old and a resident of Baltimore City. I grew up in Baltimore city. It is my home so it breaks my heart when I find out that the City cares more about the police and greed than our school system.

I have been given the pleasure to go to not one but two schools in Baltimore City.
