Prince George's Community College **SUPPORTS House Bill 0098**, which repeals the termination date of the Maryland Higher Education Outreach and Access Pilot Program, requires the Governor to include in the annual budget bill a certain appropriation for the program, alters the title of the program, and alters the dates of a report associated with the program.
