--Providing a right to counsel to Maryland residents in immigration cases is a proven means of keeping families and communities together and avoiding the resulting social, economic, and public health costs of deportation.

--In conclusion: Maryland residents must be able to invoke and enforce the right to legal representation in any immigration proceeding where their liberty is at stake to provide for equal access to justice and the courts. Maryland residents facing deportation must have a right to legal representation in immigration proceedings. The State of Maryland must provide this representation to Maryland residents to assist in the fair administration of justice.
