Chairman Clippinger and Members of the House Judiciary Committee, as a long time resident of Montgomery County, I am opposed to taxpayer funded legal representation for people who are here illegally. No one is prohibiting them from obtaining legal counsel and deportation is a civil matter, by in large. If this bill were to be enacted, it would be unfair, to those citizens who need legal representation for other civil proceedings, such as bankruptcy, or divorce. How come taxpayer funded legal representation is not being provided to them? That would only seem **fair** – but they, too, are welcome to obtain legal counsel.
