Bill: House Bill 138 - Sexual Abuse and Assault Awareness and Prevention Program - Human and Sex Trafficking

Dear Chairman Kaiser, Vice Chair Washington, and Members of the Committee:

I am writing on behalf of the Maryland School Psychologists' Association (MSPA), a professional organization representing about 500 school psychologists in Maryland. We advocate for the social-emotional, behavioral, and academic wellbeing of students and families across the state.

House Bill 138 would require MSDE and non-public schools to promote the awareness and prevention of human and sex trafficking in grades six through eight through age-appropriate, explicit instruction. In addition to what is already taught in sex education, children would learn differences between appropriate sexual interactions and those that are abusive and illegal. Developmentally appropriate education on the awareness and prevention of human and sex trafficking is vital to protecting Maryland's students.
