Re: Support House Bill 1285 – Maryland Electricians Act - Revisions

Independent Electrical Contractors (IEC) Chesapeake supports House Bill (HB) 1285 and requests a favorable report. HB1285 is a follow up to the 2021 legislation which created a statewide journeyperson electrician license. HB1285 spells out how an electrician with requisite work experience or the completion of an approved electrician apprenticeship program can become a journeyperson electrician by approval of the Maryland State Board of Electricians.

Applicants for a journeyperson electrician license do not have to take an exam if by December 31, 2022 they provide:

- written proof of four (4) years of work experience providing electrical services under the control or direction of a master electrician; or
- written proof that they have successfully completed an electrician apprenticeship program approved by the Maryland Apprenticeship and Training Council (MATC) or the Federal Office of Apprenticeship. The program must consist of at least 576 classroom hours and 8,000 hours of work experience.

HB1285 is designed to allow experienced electrical workers to become journeypersons electricians in Maryland. This will create efficiency for electrical contractors and their workforce without compromising safety. For nearly a decade, IEC Chesapeake has worked closely with its industry partners and local and state officials in an effort to create a statewide journey person electrician license. HB1285 builds upon the passage of last year's legislation and creates a clear path to license much needed journeyperson electricians.
