The Maryland Nurses Association (MNA) opposes *House Bill 1111 – Prescription Drug Monitoring Program – Prescribers of Opioids – Notification Requirement*. The bill would require prescribers and dispensers of opioids to notify the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program about several items: 1) whether the prescriber has received education regarding the risks of opioid use; 2) if the prescriber is aware of the availability of opioid reversal drugs; and 3) whether the prescriber has dispensed an opioid reversal drug.

MNA appreciates the intent of the bill in terms of increasing education of health care providers. However, the legislation duplicates existing education requirements for holders of a controlled dangerous substance (CDS) registration. All health care practitioners with a CDS registration must take a course which includes the information delineated in the bill. For this reason, we ask for an unfavorable report on this legislation.
