## Bill: House Bill 625 – Commission to Study the Health Care Workforce Crisis in Maryland - Establishment

## **Position: Support With Amendment**

I am writing on behalf of the Maryland School Psychologists' Association (MSPA), a professional organization representing about 500 school psychologists in Maryland. We advocate for the social-emotional, behavioral, and academic well-being of students and families across the state.

We support this bill because our state is currently experiencing serious shortages in our health care workforce. One important part of our health care workforce are the providers that work in our schools. Although we think HB 625 is a good first step, we would like to see a clarifying amendment to make clear this commission should also look at health provider workforce shortages in our schools, including certified school psychologists.
