- (c) (1) The Commission shall consist of nine voting members: 1 2Eight appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of 2 the Senate and one of whom shall be from a list of proposed candidates DESIGNATED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF HOWARD COUNTY AND ONE OF WHOM SHALL BE FROM A LIST OF PROPOSED CANDIDATES DESIGNATED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY, FOUR OF WHOM SHALL BE FROM A LIST OF PROPOSED **CANDIDATES** 4 DESIGNATED BY A RESOLUTION OF THE DC METROPLEX BWI COMMUNITY 5 ROUNDTABLE, OR ITS SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION; and 6 (ii) The Secretary of Transportation, who shall be the Chairman of 7 the Commission. 8 (2) The Secretary of Commerce shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio 9 Commission member. 10 (d) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (3) of this subsection, the 11 Governor may not appoint to the Commission: 12 An officer or employee of the State, except as provided in subsection (c) of this section; 13 14 A representative of any entity whose principal activities are (ii) 15 related to the operation of State-owned airports; 16 A person employed by any entity whose principal activities are (iii) related to the operation of State-owned airports; or 17 18 A member of the General Assembly. (iv) 19 In appointing the eight members of the Commission, the Governor shall 20 take into consideration both the geographic and ethnic representation of the State such that all segments of the population of the State to the extent possible are represented on 2122 the Commission. 23 Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, a member of any 24State board, commission, or authority may be appointed a member of the Maryland Aviation Commission. Any person so appointed who is compensated by the State is not 2526 entitled to any compensation or other emolument, except expenses incurred in connection 27 with attendance at hearings, meetings, field trips, and working sessions, for any services rendered as a Commissioner. 28

- 1 (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is 2 appointed and qualifies.
- 3 (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the 4 rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- 5 (f) (1) The Commission shall meet at a time and place designated by the 6 Chairman of the Commission.
- 7 (2) The Commission shall meet as often as its duties require, but not less 8 than quarterly.
- 9 (3) (i) Attendance by five members shall constitute a quorum.
- 10 (ii) No formal action may be taken by the Commission except by an affirmative vote of a majority of the entire Commission.
- 12 (g) Except as provided under subsection (d)(3) of this section, members of the Commission appointed by the Governor are entitled to the compensation and expenses provided for in the State budget. Members of the Commission are subject to the provisions of § 8–501 of the State Government Article.
- 16 (H) (1) EACH MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION SHALL RECEIVE AN 17 ORIENTATION SESSION TO EDUCATE THE MEMBER ON THE COMMISSION'S DUAL 18 RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(1) OF THIS SECTION.

- 26 (a) Subject to § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the Commission shall report by January 15 of each year to the General Assembly on the activities of the Commission during the previous year.

- 30 (1) A review of the financial and operational results for all State-owned 31 airports during the previous year, A SUMMARY OF COMMISSION INITIATIVES 32 SUPPORTING HEALTHY, LIVABLE COMMUNITIES, and any recommendations of the 33 Commission for future changes in legislation, capital funding, for operational flexibility,

- 3 (2) Subject to review by the Department of Budget and Management, an 4 estimate of all expenditures necessary for the operation of the Commission. The estimate 5 shall identify staff resources allocated to the Commission that are provided by the 6 Department or other State agencies; and
- 7 (3) Actions taken by the Commission pursuant to § 5–201.1(a) of this 8 subtitle, including the consideration of the comparative status of employees serving at 9 comparable airports or aeronautical agencies.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
