## House Bill 198

Wastewater Treatment Plants – Water Quality Testing and Sewage Overflow and Pipeline Breakage Notification (Environmental Accountability Act of 2023)

Chesapeake Bay Foundation (CBF) **SUPPORTS** HB 198 which requires independent third party oversight of water quality monitoring, testing, lab analysis and reporting for wastewater treatment plants that have catastrophic failures or significant reporting violations.

Recent failures at major wastewater treatment plants (WWTPs) in Baltimore and St. Mary's County illustrate the risk of self-reporting when internal plant operations are deficient coupled with poor oversight by the Maryland Department of the Environment. The discharge of partially treated wastewater, severe exceedances of permit limits for nitrogen reversing progress on the state's Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP) for the Chesapeake and contaminated shellfish made headlines, embarrassed the state, and resulted in costly fines, court cases, and remedial action. Back River WWTP is just recently, as a result of months of such third party oversight by Maryland Environmental Service, complying with its permit limits. Patapsco WWTP continues to struggle with sludge processing and biosolids handling.

The stopgap measure recommended by HB 198 is welcome policy to prevent such occurrences in the future. Our investments through the Bay Restoration Fund in facility upgrades to Enhanced Nutrient Removal are working to help clean up the bay. But these gains are tenuous if poor plant operation, maintenance, reporting, and oversight are allowed to continue.
