Subject: HB247—Criminal Procedure-Medical Emergency-Immunity

Position: Support

The Legislative Committee of the Criminal Law and Practice Section of the Maryland State Bar Association (MSBA) Supports HB247—Criminal Procedure-Medical Emergency-Immunity.

This bill clarifies Criminal Procedure § 1-210 to make clear that a person experiencing a medical emergency is immune from arrest, charge, or prosecution for drug or alcohol possession offenses if the evidence of those offenses was obtained as a result of the person seeking or receiving medical assistance. The current language of the bill provides immunity for the person who seeks medical help but is ambiguous with regard to immunity for the person who receives medical assistance. Fear of criminal prosecution should not deter people experiencing a medical emergency after using drugs or alcohol from seeking medical attention.
