NDMU is committed to maintaining a campus environment that is free from sexual harassment and violence. Thank you for the opportunity to provide this testimony in support of House Bill 412 — Criminal Law - Sexual Crimes - Consent and Second-Degree Rape Written Support. The bill would change Maryland's rape law to focus on whether there is clear and voluntary agreement between the people involved.

The definition of consent proposed includes:

- Clear and voluntary agreement
- The right to withdraw consent
- Communication through words or conduct

Consent is not:

- what someone is wearing,
- prior relationship, or
- as a result of fear, threat, or coercion

I am appalled that Maryland law requires more than lack of consent to prove rape. I strongly disagree with the current law. People should never have sex with someone without their consent.

I urge the Judiciary Committee to report favorably on House Bill 412.
