The Maryland Nurses Association (MNA) supports *House Bill 44 – Correctional Services – Pregnant Incarcerated Individuals – Substance Abuse Assessment and Treatment*. The bill would require that substance abuse disorder screening and treatment be available for individuals who are incarcerated and pregnant. The bill would also require that appropriate referrals be made at the time of release.

MNA believes that every incarcerated individual should have access to that the health services they need to address all their health issues, including substance use disorders. It is especially important for pregnant individuals to have access to medication assisted treatment as it helps the individuals maintain their own health as well as a healthy pregnancy. Upon release, it continues to be critical for individuals to be able to access services within their communities.

We have a technical amendment that will allow the bill to recognize two other advanced practice clinicians who provide pregnancy care and work in in the field substance use disorder services during pregnancy:

On page 2 in line 6 after “NURSE PRACTITIONER” insert “CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST, LICENSED CERTIFIED MIDWIFE”
