Re: **TESTIMONY OF SUPPORT**: HB 427: Higher Education - Community College Facilities Renewal Grant Program - Alterations

Dear Chair Barnes, Vice Chair Chang, and Members of the Committee,

I commend Delegate Jones for sponsoring House Bill 427, which would double the number of Community College Facilities Renewal Grants available each year so that every community college can receive this critical funding.

Community colleges play an integral role in our communities and in Maryland's economy. During my annual State of the County address last year, I was pleased to announce an additional \$10 million commitment in capital funding for the Howard Community College Workforce Development and Skilled Trades Center. I am proud of the work that Howard Community Collegeone of the best colleges in the nation- has been able to achieve to create a highly skilled workforce. This grant will provide a strong return on investment on the critical infrastructure students need to excel in the classroom and beyond.

Expanding this grant to all 16 community colleges each year will help address the backlog of deferred maintenance and renovations needed to ensure these higher education institutions remain competitive. I welcome your support and urge a favorable report on House Bill 427.
