Marylanders Against Poverty (MAP) strongly supports SB 482, which possesses an intentional focus on building the intersection between community impact and reducing child poverty by addressing systemic barriers.

SB 482 creates an additional opportunity for human capital investment in support of improving outcomes for children and families, while laying the foundation to meet the critical gaps in infrastructure at the community level. If passed, this bill will also harness the power of community impact from early childcare and education to affordable housing, and public safety. This funding represents a direct investment in communities experiencing multi-generational poverty and its repercussions. Continuous investment in these communities through programs provides residents with opportunities to overcome barriers and challenges they would otherwise face. The ENOUGH Act supports cradle-to-career investments in youth and families, a strategy the State would benefit from.

MAP appreciates your consideration and urges the committee to issue a favorable report for SB 482.
