My uncle Melvin had a stroke that truly made him more dependent on me. He had dysphagia which required me to make sure his food was soft and well cut up to swallow. I prepared all his meals, maintained his laundry, took him to doctors' appointments, dressed him, safeguarded the home for him, and a host of life changing requirements. It was exactly like having an adult child. I had to manage this and a job. As a contractor with limited leave, I had to use my vacation time or my sick leave to be able to take him to appointments or to be with him if he was sick. I often wondered what would happen if I became ill, how would I get through this?
