HB 60: Rehabilitation Services - Disability - Definition Position: Support

8601 Robert Fulton Dr Suite 140 Columbia, MD 21046 The Maryland Developmental Disabilities Coalition (DD Coalition) is comprised of five statewide organizations that are committed to improving the opportunities and outcomes for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and their families. As such, the DD Coalition supports HB 60.



WHAT does this legislation do?

1500 Union Avenue Suite 2000 Baltimore, MD 21211 It changes the definition of disability to "physical or mental impairment that constitutes or results in a substantial impediment to employment of independent living."



WHY is this important?

8835 Columbia 100 Pky Suite P Columbia, MD 21044 The proposed definition aligns with federal law. The disability community advocated for Federal language changes that removed mention of "defect," "infirmities," and "incapacitation" which are outdated and offensive.



While disability may result in the need for additional supports and services to meaningfully engage in employment or independent living, disability is a natural part of the human experience and does not diminish the right of people to meaningfully participate in society.

217 E Redwood Street Suite 1300 Baltimore, MD 21202 State vocational rehabilitation (VR) services programs, authorized by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and amended by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), provide services for people with disabilities to prepare for and engage in competitive integrated employment and achieve economic self-sufficiency. The Division of Rehabilitation Services (DORS) is Maryland's VR program, and plays a critical role for people with disabilities who want to get or keep a job.
