Re: HB 27 – No–Knock Warrants

Members of the Committee,

As the Executive Director of the Maryland NAACP, I am writing to express our strong support for House Bill 27, which seeks to repeal the authority for the issuance and execution of noknock search warrants in our state. This crucial legislation also establishes guidelines for the execution of search warrants to ensure the protection of the rights and safety of Maryland residents.

No-knock search warrants have been a contentious issue, particularly in communities of color, where they have often been used disproportionately and have resulted in tragic consequences.
