NAMI Maryland and our 11 local affiliates across the state represent a network of more than 58,000 families, individuals, community-based organizations, and service providers. NAMI Maryland is a 501(c)(3) non-profit dedicated to providing education, support, and advocacy for people living with mental illnesses, their families, and the wider community.

NAMI MD supports public policies and laws that enable all schools, public and private, to increase access to appropriate mental health services. Undiagnosed, untreated, or inadequately treated mental illnesses in children can significantly interfere with a student's ability to learn, grow and develop. Because children spend much of their productive time in school, NAMI believes that both public and private elementary, middle, and high schools should provide and/or facilitate and sustain provision of appropriate mental health services, supports, and appropriate accommodations.

This includes convenient and easily accessible information, including widely publicized availability of the 24/7 crisis hot-line. By including the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline and the Safe Schools Maryland anonymous tipline in school handbooks and on student's school identification cards, we are equipping Maryland's youth with appropriate mental health and crisis services, should they ever need to utilize them.

For these reasons, we urge a favorable report.
