Additionally, the bill acknowledges the broader impact of reducing medical debt on household finances and overall health. By eliminating unnecessary tests for income-eligible patients, House Bill 328 contributes to financial and health equity, especially benefiting low-income communities, including individuals with disabilities who in many other ways experience significant barriers to health and independence.

The bill advocates for the sensible use of charity care. While Maryland's nonprofit hospitals receive funding for free and reduced-cost care, the current system allows for high rates of charity care denial. House Bill 328 aims to streamline this process, facilitating easier approval of applications without compromising hospitals' financial stability. House Bill 328 marks a significant stride towards creating a fair and accessible healthcare system in Maryland. I urge you to support this legislation to ensure that income-eligible individuals receive the necessary care, fostering equity and well-being across our communities.
