My name is Richard Keith Kaplowitz. I am a resident of District 3. I am submitting this testimony in support of Crossover Bill HB#/0607, Community Colleges - Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship – Requirements

Not every student is interested or motivated to attend college but would learn a trade in a workforce support or vocational occupation. Courses taken to earn certification or licensure for the pursuit of that occupation can and should be supported; workers in these jobs are just as necessary in our economy as those earning two-year degrees in our community colleges system. Likewise, registered apprenticeship programs create a needed universe of trained and competent workers performing tasks and jobs that support all of us.

This bill is an acknowledgement that scholarship monies should apply equally to those in both standard community college programs and to those courses taken in a vocational setting.
