Dear Chair Peña-Melnyk and Committee members:

The Maryland Department of Health (Department) and Maryland's Office of Overdose Response respectfully submit this letter of support for House Bill (HB) 295 – Overdose Awareness Day. HB 295 will require the Governor to annually announce August 31st each year as Overdose Awareness day.

Overdose Awareness Day remembers those lost to overdoses and increases awareness of substance use disorders. This day is observed each year across the globe, leading into September, which is Recovery Month. An official proclamation of August 31st as Overdose Awareness Day would emphasize Maryland's commitment to addressing the issue of substance use and overdose in our communities and would honor the many Marylanders who have died of an overdose.
