The Maryland Alliance for Justice Reform (MAJR) asks you to oppose HB 727 Juvenile Law - Custodial Interrogation - In-Person Attorney Consultation Requirement.

We believe that it is ill-advised to change the current law, which allows video conference and telephone consultations with an attorney as an alternative to inperson consultation with juveniles. To prolong the period a child is forced to stay in custody, due to delays in getting an in-person consultation with their attorney, is against the best interest of the child who will be under considerable stress until the episode is resolved. In addition, a requirement for in-person consultation will slow police investigations and require additional resources from the public defender's office.

The Maryland Alliance for Justice Reform (MAJR) is a nonpartisan, all-volunteer organization of nearly 2000 Marylanders who advocate for sensible evidence-based legislative and policy changes in Maryland's correctional practices.
