

Testimony is Support of House Bill 455 Comptroller - Electronic Tax and Fee Return Filing Requirements

House Ways and Means Committee February 8, 2024

Maryland Rise supports HB 455, which gradually moves the state to online tax filing, with important exceptions for populations who may face challenges using electronic filing systems.

Moving towards online tax services has many benefits for taxpayers and the state overall. With online services, the Comptroller's office has noted filers will see improved response times, increased access to information, and a reduction in harm from lost or stolen mail. Moreover, the Comptroller's office will save the state resources by making tax filing more convenient, accessible, error-free, and user-friendly. A modern tax collection system is a benefit to all Marylanders.

HB 455 includes important exemptions to online filing for groups who may face challenges with an online system. The legislation creates exemptions for older adults, low-income households, Marylanders with disabilities, and small businesses. This is critically important, as a new tax system shouldn't marginalize populations who are unable to use online services.

Maryland Rise appreciates your consideration and urges the committee to issue a favorable report on HB 455.
