Good Afternoon Chairperson Atterbeary, Vice Chair Wilkins, and members of the Ways and Means Committee, my name is Kevin Maxwell. I am a retired educator and here as the Chairperson of the Board of the Maryland Association for Environmental and Outdoor Education. Let me begin by thanking all of you for your work to support the citizens of Maryland and your past support of our Green Schools Program. I would also like to thank Delegate Wolek and the additional sponsors of HB 1102.
